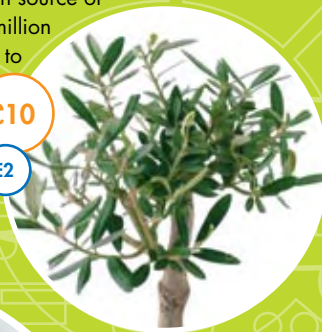
Olive Tree

Dig a Well

Of all things in life, safe water is one of the most basic privileges we could ask for. By digging a well, you can quench the thirst of entire communities whilst ensuring their agriculture and livestock flourish well into the future.

Water Purifier

Ever used the sun's UV rays to remove impurities from water? Well, here's your chance! Our solar water purifier is ideal for remote locations with no access to power. Watch the sun get to work and provide families with safe water free from the risk of infection and disease.

Fruit Trees

If variety is the spice of life, then these fruit trees are no exception. Ranging from mangos and papayas to mulberries, planting a fruit tree provides communities with food appropriate to their local diet, brings environmental benefits and also provides income as surplus fruit can be sold.

Solar Lantern

Electricity is expensive and in many places impossible to come across. Using just the pure natural rays of the sun, these solar lanterns charge during the day and at night can light a whole room and provide relief from hours of darkness by illuminating homes, schools and mosques in rural communities throughout the world.



Solar Torch

Just as our solar lanterns use the rays of the sun to provide light, these solar torches operate on identical eco-friendly principles. They are ideal for travelling between locations as they provide directed light and run for up to 5 hours.



Water Container

A clean source solves only half the problem of ready access to water. In the aftermath of an emergency, water storage becomes a critical issue as many don't have containers to transport clean water to their homes. Children and the elderly are the most at risk and your water container will ensure families have a store of clean water throughout an emergency period.



Family Tent

One of the most pressing needs in emergency situations is shelter. When families are left with nowhere to sleep, these sturdy waterproof tents become an essential temporary home for disaster victims and are used for 6 months or more. Provide a family with the relief of having a place to stay during their most difficult time.



Emergency Relief

Utensils

Pots, pans, cutlery and household utensils are an essential part of daily living; particularly with families and children. Providing basic utensils at times of emergency allows disaster victims to cook for themselves and maintains a basic level of hygienic living to prevent illness.



Family Food Parcel

When families are at their most vulnerable, even the most basic supplies of food provide relief from the burden of hunger. Packed with a variety of essentials such as oil, rice, flour and staple grains — food parcels are a key aspect of our emergency response and meet the most pressing nutritional needs of individuals.

Plastic Sheeting

Strong and resilient — plastic sheets protect against rain and light snowfall whilst providing shelter and security. Though simple in function, plastic sheets are one of the most useful and sought after emergency care items. This gift will provide a basic level of protection for those left vulnerable and exposed.

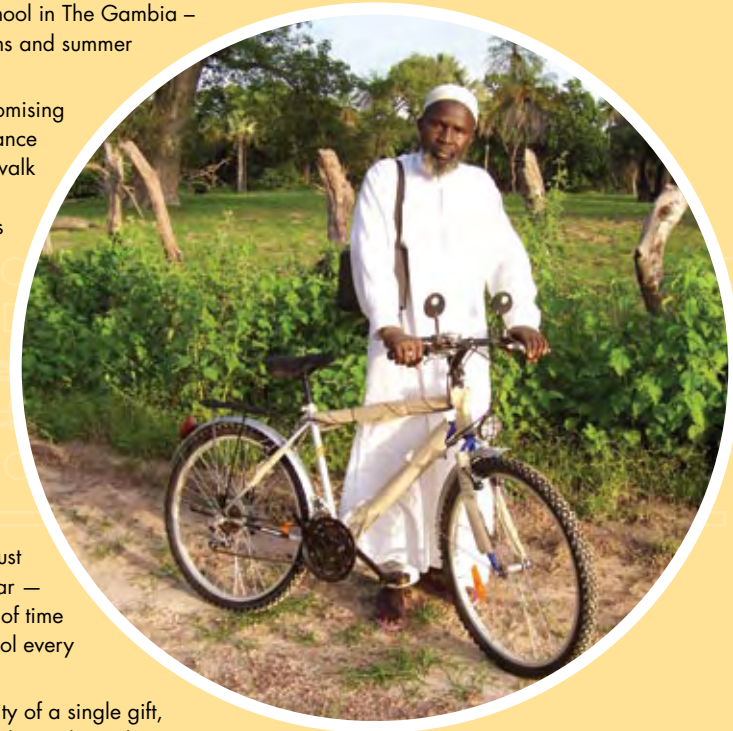
A Tale of Two Bicycles

It's remarkable the difference a bike can make. For all his adult life, Idris Sambou made the three mile journey on foot to teach at Misra Primary School in The Gambia – both through the rainy seasons and summer heat.

Sulaiman, one of his most promising pupils, also lives a great distance from the school and used to walk an hour each way by foot. Nicknamed 'The Book' for his zeal for learning, he and his teacher were the first two beneficiaries of the Great Charity Gifts scheme.

With a bicycle Idris Sambou now saves enough time each day to teach new classes at an adult Qur'anic school in a neighbouring village. His student Sulaiman was overjoyed to receive his gift just in time for the new school year – and now saves himself hours of time spent going to and from school every day.

Never underestimate the ability of a single gift, such as these two bicycles and countless others, to transform lives *alhamdulillah*.
