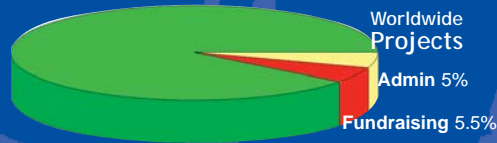

Most aid agencies have pulled out and food is running out, leaving 7.5 million people on the brink of starvation. Muslim Hands is continuing aid work in Kabul, Kandahar, Jalalabad, Chaman and Peshawar.

The bitter Afghan winter is now here and they urgently need food, medicine and shelter ...Please help *NOW* before it is too late!

Palestine in Crisis

from bad to worse, and no end in sight

Events since the Al-Aqsa Intifadah have plunged Palestine into a situation it has never been in before.

The number of people living below the poverty line has dramatically increased to record levels due to job losses as a result of frequent blockades of the West Bank and Gaza. The continuing strife has had a crippling effect on the Palestinian economy and way of life.

Although the food parcels we are distributing are a much needed contribution, other forms of assistance especially medical care, education and training are also desperately needed to help bring normality back to the people of Palestine.

India Earthquake

Day of celebration turns to terror

On January 26, 2001 India celebrated Republic Day. As the colourful parades and processions got under way the continent reverberated to the worst earthquake in India's history, measuring 7.9 on the richter scale.

The epicentre in Gujrat was the scene of maximum devastation. The city of Bhuj, home to 150,000 people was turned into rubble almost instantly, with hardly a building left standing.

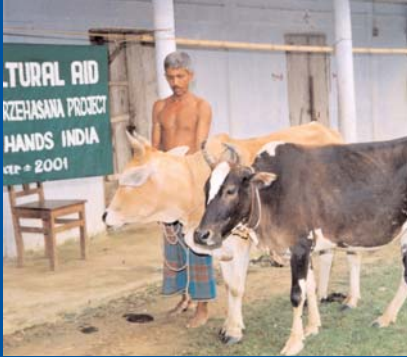
More than 70,000 people died that dreadful day. India's national day soon became a day of international sorrow.

Muslim Hands aid teams in the area immediately setup feeding centres and provided shelter to the homeless. Our emergency centre at Luni, just outside Bhuj, distributed food, tents and other essentials including blankets and torches to surrounding villages and towns.

- **15 tubewells** installed
- **3 mosques** rebuilt
- Over **100** people receive **business start-up** loan
- 200 higher education **students** sponsored

- **42 new homes** built
- Over **500** children received **books and clothes**





Agriculture & Livestock

Small-scale farmers work hard but their yields are low. Their land is often poor and most cannot afford the equipment and animals they need. Furthermore natural disasters often wipe-out livestock, which are a vital part of their livelihood.

Muslim Hands has initiated various agricultural aid schemes supporting poor farmers to replenish livestock levels, improve their harvests and generate incomes for their families.

- **9 needy families** replenished with **livestock** after Pakistan floods
- **200 needy families** receive **agriculture tools & seeds** in Mozambique
- **5000** people benefitted from **livestock replenishment in Ethiopia**

Small loans £100 for Rickshaw

28 year old Abdul Salam is a poor landless labourer from Assam, one of the poorest areas in India.

Thanks to your kind donations, he is now the proud owner of his own rickshaw. Alhamdulillah, his rickshaw service helps him provide for his family of seven.

30 such rickshaws were purchased for poor labourers in Assam this year.

Furthermore, any loan repayments made by the rickshaw drivers will be used to help purchase more rickshaws. The scheme will hence help more and more people over the coming years!





Education and skills training leading to employment is the most effective way of combating poverty.

As traditional job skills are made obsolete, Muslim Hands has undertaken various initiatives to provide quality education and training to the poor.

Muslim Hands Vocational Training Centres have been offering unemployed youth a chance to gain a variety of skills in computing, short-hand, electrical installation and maintenance, dress-making and other crafts such as welding and carpentry.

The success of Muslim Hands Vocational Training Centres, especially the Computer Literacy Centres has been phenomenal. With more than 3500 students graduating from our centres in the past 6 years. Many of them are now in full time employment.

Education empowers the weak and oppressed, and is also a most effective doorway out of poverty - hence it is one of Muslim Hands' primary mandates.

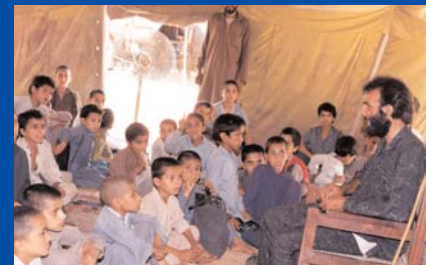
We run educational projects in almost all of the 34 countries in which we operate. From small primary schools in remote villages to technical colleges for adults, with courses running from basic literacy to state recognised qualifications in IT etc - the projects are as diverse as the people they serve and tailored to their needs.

Occupied Kashmir Leprosy Hospital

helping the shunned



Throughout history, the sufferers of leprosy have often been ostracised by society. An intense fear of leprosy still persists, leading to stigmatisation of affected persons and their families.

Leprosy is a chronic, infectious disease. It affects the skin and peripheral nerves and if left untreated, there can be permanent damage to the skin, nerves, limbs and eyes. About 70% of the world's registered leprosy patients live in India.

How your donations helped

- **New sanitation block and Occupational Therapy Unit built** at Leprosy Hospital in Occupied Kashmir

In Srinagar, Occupied Kashmir, Muslim Hands has been supporting a Leprosy Hospital. Through your generosity, the patients at this hospital have received food, clothing and blankets regularly over the past five years.

This year we built a new sanitation block at the hospital and have opened an 'occupational therapy unit' which also generates some income for the hospital.

The 'Help the Elderly Scheme' provides a **regular monthly income** to such poor people in Pakistan, India, Bangladesh, The Gambia and Senegal.

Those who are **alone, without any immediate family, income, and without permanent residence**, are given preference. A worker is also assigned to ensure that the elderly person is clothed, fed and sheltered.

For £10 per month you can help provide food, clothing and rent for an elderly person.

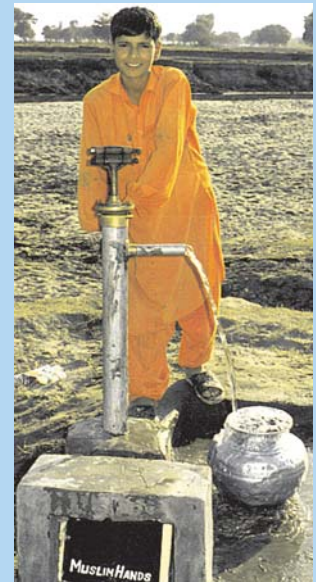
As many as three million people die every year as a result of water-related diseases and approximately 80% of all sickness and disease is due to inadequate water supplies and poor sanitation.

Every year Muslim Hands installs hundreds of safe water projects ranging from small bore tube wells and water storage schemes to the laying of water pipelines that span large distances and supply whole towns.

£100 installs one complete tubewell. This will serve a whole community with clean and safe drinking water. A name plate of your choice will be fitted to tube wells or at the location.

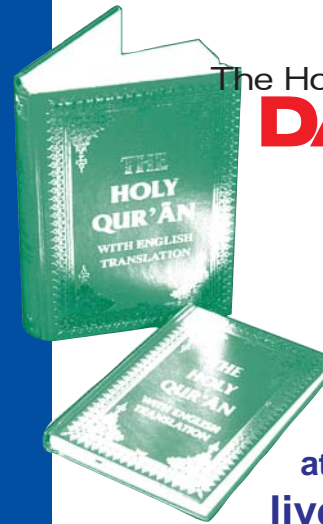

'Charity is a necessity for every Muslim' (Hadith)

Zakah is the right of the poor in the wealth of the rich and is not optional charity

What is Zakah?

Zakah is an obligatory duty and one of the five pillars of Islam. 2.5% of ones wealth must be paid to the poor, by all muslims when two conditions are satisfied: Nisab and Due Date.

What is Nisab?

It is 2.8 oz / 87g of pure Gold or the equivalent value in money.

What is due date?

Zakah is due after one year, starting from either the first day you acquired the amount of Nisab or the day you paid Zakah last year.

Example: Mrs. Ahmad owns a necklace weighing 45g of pure gold, worth £315 at current market rate. (When you calculate your Zakah, please check value of gold with your local gold seller or call us). She has **savings in her bank account of £1250**, and she holds **shares in a company that now have a resale value of £250**.

Total value of wealth: £1250 + £315 + £250 = **£1815**

Value of Nisab is 87grams - that is £609 at current market value. Since she has more wealth than Nisab she must pay 2.5% of it as Zakah to needy muslims.
2.5% of £1815 is £45.38 of Zakah

A word about Interest (Riba):

Please let us know when you send us your interest money, we will not treat it as Zakah or Sadaqah. Your money will still be used to help the needy.

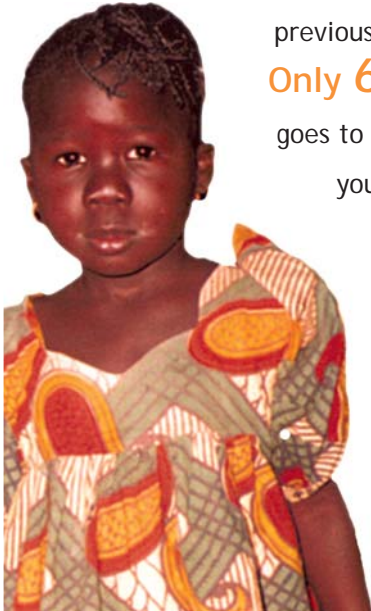
